Greyhound Racing Second Schedule Minor Infringement Schedule

Introduction

The update of the Minor Infringement System for greyhound racing provides an opportunity to transfer some minor breaches of the rules of racing, previously dealt with by way of filing an Information, into the Minor Infringement System (MIS).

As a result, this updated MIS has been promulgated.

This update ensures that penalties imposed meet the requirements of the Racing Industry Act 2020 and are in conformity with the Greyhound New Zealand Rules of Racing.

Desired Outcome

An important and desirable outcome of transferring minor infringements into the schedule is to assist in streamlining adjudication hearing processes. Not only is it more effective, but it is also more efficient and frees up time of stewards, trainers, and other officials who might otherwise be required to attend hearings for relatively minor infringements.

Objectives

In addition to improving outcomes, increasing the scope of breaches that can now be dealt with by way of the Minor Infringement System to enable and support industry wide integrity objectives namely, to ensure:

- 1. Penalties imposed for minor infringements are consistent and align with contemporary precedent case results.
- 2. Transparency so stakeholders are aware of the consequences of breaching any of the rules contained within the schedule.
- 3. Penalties imposed operate as a deterrent and uphold and maintain the high standards expected of those participating in thoroughbred racing.
- 4. Penalties imposed uphold the integrity of racing and protect the racing industry, participants, and the public.
- 5. Penalties reflect both the focus on animal welfare, and health and safety standards.
- 6. Penalties reflect GRNZ policy intent.
